employment recruitment and retention strategies.

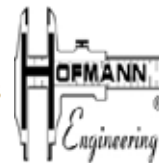

## LEAPS Project- Update

The EMICoL LEAPS program has taken off in "leaps and bounds" with members having rallied together and opening their doors to school Industry visits.

The 12th of September will see a joint venture between Project Industries and Goodwill Engineering, taking twenty year 11 and 12 students through their businesses from Balga SHS, who have a keen interest in Manufacturing.

Both organisations have been proactive in developing an interactive tour specifically catered for this age group.

Hofmann Engineering, in the persona of Peter Middleton together with their 2007 Apprentice of the Year, will be heading up to Bullsbrook District High School on the 16th of September to address year 10 and 11 students, regarding the exciting and diverse career pathways available in Manufacturing and Engineering industries.

On the 18th of September, Goodwill Engineering will be hosting a tour for year 9 students from Kalamunda Education Support Centre. The school principal was thrilled at the opportunity, being a first for her middle school students with special needs to be exposed to this industry area.

As part of the LEAPS Project and funding received from the Federal Government, a technical committee made up of Project Industries, Wallis Drilling and Verriers Engineering have been hard at work developing a hands-on Project for students to do during their Structured Workplace Learning Placement in 2009.

Working collaboratively with Swan TAFE Midland, students will have the opportunity to access a two day course covering OHS topics, metal joining, and measuring, and basic hand tool theory prior to their placement. Pacific Safety, one of our member sponsors, has kindly offered to provide uniforms for 20 students!

An official booklet with the program overview and technical project design will be developed and the program will be launched through the education districts in October 2008.

### WELL Funding (Workplace English Language and Literacy program)

WELL funding is a Commonwealth Government grant-seeding fund to support the cost of workplace training in workplaces. In partnership with RTO's employers can apply for funding to reduce their cash costs for providing training at their workplace. There is an opportunity for EMICoL small and medium business members to apply for funding as a cluster. West Coast TAFE whom is the WELL funding provider will support members in developing and completing the application form. ## EMICoL Training Initiatives

In recent discussions with the EMICoL Board of Directors and Members, an urgent need to promote and market Engineering and Fabrication as a highly valued and prosperous career option has been identified.

These career options would apply to school leavers and existing unskilled workers as well as the need to promote training and up-skilling as a worth while return on investment to industry.

As a result, a number of initiatives between EMICoL and TAFE have been developed to address these issues. The following list of programs are being developed or implemented in response to this industry concern:

1. The LEAPS program for high schools students
2. A Certificate 1 family of trades program for high school students
3. The Fast track apprenticeship system for mature age workers
4. The Transforming Trades delivery model

EMICoL in conjunction with Swan TAFE are holding a series of short information and debate forums on many topics with the aim to get industry perspective on these issues.

You will notice a number of Member Forums will be scheduled from now to Christmas and will also be held at industry premises thanks to hosting organisations who are keen to get involved and showcase their own initiatives to the members and other interested guests.

We look forward to your input and attendance at these meetings with a view to create momentum to keep industry involved and open forums for ideation and the development of opportunities.
